Arising out of the discussions, some of the points that emerged were:

to start working on the Aims and Objectives, Articles of Association, Byelaws, Rules and Regulations of the proposed registered body of MGAs. MGA Global Meet 2022-During the discussions on holding the next MGA Global Meet, several factors of suitability of place, venue, time and affordability were taken into account.

MA Damrong from Thailand informed that the Provincial House Retreat Centre in Bankok would be the suitable venue for the Global meet and that the rooms have to be booked in advance. He mentioned also that MGA will have to take up the total planning and execution.

The estimated cost of stay per day would be Rs 2350 INR per day for a 2BR and food expenses woud be around Rs 2125 per day per person.

It was suggested that more inputs could be carried out with regard to holding MGA Global Meet. Some members suggested that holding Global Meet in different venues promoted togetherness.

It was suggested that a Zoom Meet may be planned exclusively to hosting next MGA Global Meet in 2022.

## Random Remembrances-Br Michael By Jo Pathyil...

#### 0.1 The Mentor Lands

(Jo Continues his Journey thru the Spectrum of Br Michael...)



Joe Pathyil Recalls . . .

Bro. Michael was the principal of Assumption College, Bangkok for several years. However in 1941 he came to India, and was appointed the Novice Master of the newly established Novitiate. He was also responsible for the juniorate where youngsters completed their High School certification, before joining the novitiate. In 1947, when I arrived in Coonoor, I was accompanied by my father as he wanted to see the facilities for himself. At the gates of the St. Antony's, surrounded by novices and postulants, stood a tall white missionary. With greying hair, beard flowing to his wide chest, Bro. Michael looked every bit as my cousin had described him. Thatha, Tamil for grandfather, suited him. Bro. Michael and my father became good friends. In fact in 1948, when Bro. Michael went to visit Travancore, he spent a couple of days in our house in Kaipuzha and went to Athirampuzha for the church festival and the fireworks that was the grand finale of the week of festivities. .

#### 0.2 Thatha The Versatile

Bro. Michael was a versatile person. In addition to the Rules of the Society, he also taught the novices The Bible, Psychology, music, church history, meditation, philosophy, and other varied subjects, and compiled booklets. He found time to accompany youngsters on their weekly three-hour walks, and occasional day-long picnics. He taught singing, including to read musical notes. Latin church liturgical songs, English hymns, French songs, were taught by Bro. Michael. In preparations for Christmas, Holy Week, feasts of saints etc.etc., Bro. Michael would spend many hours teaching the novices and juniors. The very preparation of these events instilled impetus and enthusiasm in the young men. He insisted that the postulants and novices learn French. There were daily classes in rudimentary French. The novices had to read lives of saints in the refectory in French. The constant effort to teach pronunciation of certain French sounds often brought giggles and laughter. On special occasions, there were skits and singing in French. Popular songs in France such as Alouette, Chanson de montagnards, Roland etc. were known to us even before we studied French. In 1950

when Bro. Anastase, the then Superior General visited Coonoor, we sang the song composed by the General himself as he accompanied us on the organ in the chapel. "Montfort o pere, ton people espere en ton pouvoir, en ta bonte".

### 0.3 The Spectrum Unfolds

Bro. Michael was the first to rise and last one to retire for the night. He met each one every few days in private to direct them in their personal lives. He was a good listener, compassionate, encouraging, comforting, advising, and always positive. He knew what was trivial, and what really mattered. A man of positive thoughts and cheerful disposition, he would not be influenced by rumors and gossips. He chose the names for the novices, and we would pick the lottery. The highlight of the vestition ceremony was the eagerly anticipated new name.

## 0.4 The Baton Changes Hands

Thatha hardly ever took a holiday. But in 1951 he was sent to Tailand for a few months as the official delegate of the central administration in order to preside over the golden jubilee of the arrival of the brothers in that country. He was accorded cordial receptions everywhere he went. After a few months of break, he returned to resume his duties in Coonoor. Ours was the last batch to complete our novitiate in Coonoor in 1952. In May 1952 the novitiate was shifted to Eachinkadu, Yercaud. Though Bro. Michael was reluctant about this shift initially, he enthusiastically cooperated to make the new facilities suitable. When Bro. Paul, the novice from Singapore, who was a professional photographer and artist, undertook to design a pedestal for the statue of Our Lady of Fatima, Thatha was immensely pleased. The new premises with extensive land and several buildings were put to maximum use. Young men recruited by the Brothers in Singapore and Thailand, joined the ones from India and were trained under Bro. Michael. In spite of occasional tensions, Bro. Michael was

able to guide them to become responsible members of the society. He was given several assistants to help with the curriculam of the novitiate. But as years rolled on, it was apparent that Thatha could not cope with his responsibility. Therefore, the superiors gently eased him out of his arduous task as Novice Master, though reluctantly. Bro. Michael did not live long after his retirement. He died peacefully in 1962 (?). His was a rich life of dedication, and pioneering work both in Thailand and, especially, in India. The name of Bro. Michael must be inscribed in golden letters when writing the history of The Brothers of St. Gabriel in India.

## The Art of Listening ... BO Sebastian



BO Sebastina writes....

Following is a write from the heart of an educator of excellence propelled by his inquisitive mind. Listen to him as his words speaks to us..

My Dear Friends!

Nobody learned anything by hearing themselves speak.

Most of the successful people I have known are the ones who do more listening than talking - Bernard Baruch.

Most people do not listen with the intent to understand; they listen with the intent to reply - Stephen R Covey.

To whom will you open your mind freely without any reticence / inhibition? Why? Doesn't every good conversation begin with good listening?.

All of you please stop talking and listen. Be attentive to what I say. Listen to what I am going to tell you..

We teachers repeatedly say sentences like these to make the students listen. The paradox is *We want them to listen but none of us teach how to listen.* 

In our educational system, we spend years teaching and training the three "R"s (Reading, Writing, Arithmetic). We also guide them in other curricular and co curricular

activities. But we have rarely given a class or training on developing listening skill. Man's inability to comprehend fast, to develop a photographic memory and to communicate well is the result of his failure to listen effectively. Like every conversation, every learning begins with the art of listening.

I only wish, I could find an institution that teaches people how to listen. After all, a good manager needs to listen at least as much as he needs to talk. Too many people fail to realize that real communication goes in both directions-Lee Iacocca.

Listening is the most neglected art, courtesy and necessity today says Fr. E. H. McGrath S.J. an acclaimed expert and trainer /consultant in human development.

The process of learning is *LSRW* (*Listening*, *Speaking*, *Reading and Writing*). Learning begins with listening. Shouldn't we give priority in helping our students to attain mastery over this art?.

It is easy to listen to an outstanding teacher who keeps his students spellbound by his command over the language, communication skill, method of teaching. But to listen to all teachers in all the classes is really challenging and strenuous for most of the students.

Hearing is not listening. I heard someone does not make any sense unless it is clear who said it and what has been said.

What I hear, I forget, What I see I remember, What I do I know/ understand said Confucius. To listen effectively, one should have concentration or self-control of the mind.

All eyes and ears remind us to be active listeners. When Lok Manya Tilak was questioned by his teacher, for not taking down the notes, his reply was, Sir, I remember verbatim everything you have dictated. Why should I take down notes?. The teacher was awestruck and praised him when he answered word by word the next day.

Should we be good listeners? *The ear of the leader must ring with the voices of the people* said Woodrow Wilson. The ears of the Teachers, Principals should ring with the voices of the students, and parents.

Fleming reminds us the request of a child *If you touch me soft and gentle*, *if you look at me and smile at me, if you listen to me and then talk to me, I will grow, really grow.* All of us need to listen at least as much as we need to talk. Only a good listener can be a great leader, speaker, an exceptional teacher or an outstanding principal.

Listening is courtesy: When friends, parents, teachers or students, employer or the employee speak it is politeness to listen.

Listening is a necessity: It is applicable to all whatever may be our position, profession because no one talks, teaches without a purpose. For a student especially it is a necessity.

To whom do we confide our problems and worries? The best listener is your best student, trusted friend, guide or counsellor.

The best listener is an embodiment of all qualities . He/She could be your grandparents, parents, uncles or aunts, husbands or wives for that matter. No wonder the outstanding Doctors, Psychiatrists, Counselors, Advisors thrive in their profession since they are excellent listeners. Shouldn't we be good listeners and make the learning process easier for students by giving constant listening practice and training? I conclude - BO Sebastian

## From The Land of Scientists ...

**Fr. Dr. Ignacimuthu SJ** -Congratulations to Rev. Fr. Dr. Ignacimuthu SJ who has been identified as one of the top 1 percent scientists in the world in the field of Biology based on the citations of his research publications by other scientists.

According to Fr. Dr. L. Joji SJ,Vice President,Xavier Board of Higher Education, India, Fr. Ignaci is ranked 10th among Indian scientists of Biology.

Fr. Ignacimuthu also served as Vice Chancellor of two top

Universities in Tamilnadu. It is befitting to appreciate him for his successful achievement as top 1 percent scientists in the world.

A recent research article entitled 'Updated Science-wide Author Databases of Standardized Citation Indicators' by professors John P.A. Ioannidis, Kevin W. Boyack and Jeroen Baas belonging to Stanford University, USA, published in a reputed journal PLOS BIOLOGY 18(10): e3000918; 16 Oct. 2020 has analysed the contributions of more than one lakh scientists for their impact making research publications in the field of Biology.

They analysed 1,13,961 scientists from all over the world. Fr Ignacimuthu has been ranked 872 in the world. The contributions from 1985 to 2019 are evaluated. Fr. Dr. Ignacimuthu, has been ranked below 1,000 for the last 20 years. Fr. Ignaci is ranked 10th among Indian scientists of Biology.

The achivements of Fr Ignacimuthu reminds one to recall to mind Pierre Teilhard de Chardin SJ (1 May 1881 – 10 April 1955) who was a French idealist philosopher and Jesuit Catholic priest who trained as a paleontologist and geologist and took part in the discovery of the Peking Man.


He conceived the vitalist idea of the Omega Point (a maximum level of complexity and consciousness towards which he believed the universe was evolving), and he developed with Vladimir Vernadsky the concept of noosphere. Teilhard's ideas had a profound influence on the New Age movement.

It is hoped the achivements and examples of Fr Ignacimuthu would inspire others in our Church and Community to actively involve in science and technology towards evolving a true convergence of mind body and soul in search of one's purpose in Life in the true spirit of a pilgrim in search of his destination.







Dear Bro. Jean Marie Thior (Secretary General), Regret to inform that Brother John (James) Tham Koon Seng, 91 years old, has passed away in Singapore this evening at 7.00pm Local time.

Bro. James Tham (as he is usual known), though was elderly but has been keeping reasonable health and up till today was mobile and walked about around the compound. Yesterday evening at Mass he seems to be his usual self and was able to walk to receive holy communion.

This morning he was not feeling well and did not come for breakfast and lunch. Shortly after lunch time his condition deteriorated and he was rush to the Ng Teng Fong General Hospital (NTFGH) accompanied by Bro. John Albert. He was hospitalized for observation as the doctor suspected that he may have suffered a brain stroke.

As it was COVID-19 procedure we are not able to go to immediately collect the remains at the hospital. Tomorrow morning I will go with Bro. John Albert to collect his remains and arrange for his final send off. Bro. James Tham was born on 29 August 1929 and he was one of the first few candidates from Singapore to go for the novitiate in Conoor and later was transferred to Eachinkadu.

He made his first profession on 8th May 1953, and thus he has been a religious for 67 years. He has served in Malaysia, particularly in Batu Pahat and in Singapore. At one time he was in charge of the Juniorate in Punggol.


