Let us pray for the departed souls of the doctors, nurses, and other workers who have fought for a good cause and lost their lives. Let us pray for their families.



of Associates' Movement, Montfortian Global Associates and their families.



2. St. Montfort's name was Louis Gringnion. He was born in Montfort sur Meu west of France on the 31 January 1673. So he was called Louis Gringnion de Montfort.




3. In this picture we see Montfort teaching the youth. He did the same when he was a boy. He used to gather the children of his area and pray the Rosary with them.




4. Even as a child he was very much devoted to Mother Mary. So he added the name Mary to his existing name during Confirmation and was called Louis Marie Gringnion de Montfort.



5. The boy Montfort showed extraordinary zeal in his Christian practices specially in participating in the Eucharist.



6. This is the Jesuit seminary at St. Sulpice in Paris. De Montfort did his Theology in this seminary and was ordained priest in 1700.




7. He preached retreats in many parishes. He spread the devotion to Mother Mary and Rosary wherever he went.



8. He dedicated himself totally for preaching. He was the most famous preacher of his days in France



9. He walked 320 kilometers all the way from Paris to Rome to have an audience with the Pope Clement XI. who conferred on him the title " Missionary Apostolic of France"



10. On his return, St. Montfort went to Mount Michael which is a kilometer from the sea shore in the Atlantic Ocean north of France. He made retreat for many days, to overcome temptations and for the conversion of sinners.




1. St. Montfort who was born in the 17th century was one of the most famous Marian Saints. He spent many hours in meditating in front of the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary.



2. St. Montfort was one of the greatest Marian Theologians of the church. His book on the Treatise on the True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary is very famous in the catholic church.




3. This book recommends that we should give more importance to our interior devotions and dispositions than to exterior devotions.




4. St. Montfort is the patron saint of the Legion of Mary. His book on the Treatise on the True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary is the foundation of the Legion of Mary.



5. The late Pope John Paul II practiced the **Total Consecration of** St. Montfort as given in his Treatise on the True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. This practice echoed in his papacy.




6. St. Montfort's total surrender to God through Mary Totus tuus sum ego was summarized into two words as "Totus tuus" by the Pope who offered himself to God fully.




7. "To Mary, for Mary, with Mary and through Mary" is the summary of the book on the True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.



8. The impact of St. Montfort's life, thoughts and writings reflected in the Papal encyclical "Redemptoris Mater-Mother of the Redeemer" by the late Pope John Paul II.



9. As a great writer, St. Montfort wrote 23 books which comprised hymns. Canticles, poems and biographies. Of these, "the Secret of Mary" is another book on the Blessed Virgin Mary.



10. He was also a great sculptor. He carved the Blessed Virgin Mary's images and venerated them.





Intention: During this decade let us ask St. Montfort to obtain for us the grace of deep devotion to the Rosary and to spread this devotion.


1. St. Montfort's devotion to the Rosary was the manifestation of his true devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. His book on the Secret of the Rosary deals with different ways of praying the Rosary.



2. "When the Holy Rosary is said well, it gives Jesus and Mary more glory and is more meritorious than any other prayer." These are the words of St. Montfort.




3. St. Montfort says, "There could not possibly be a finer devotion or one of greater merit than that of the Holy Rosary, which is like a second memorial and representation of the life and passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ." Hail Mary



4. " Never will any one says this Rosary, be led astray. This is a statement that I would gladly sign with my blood," says St. Montfort about those who are faithful to the Rosary.



5. "If you have strayed from the path leading to heaven, call on Mary for her name means Star of the sea"
These are the words of St. Montfort.




6. St. Montfort says, "A decade said in a recollected way will be worth more than thousands of Rosaries said in a hurry, without pausing or reflecting."




7. "It is a mysterious rose which is a source of joy to the Blessed Virgin and to the soul." These are the words of St. Montfort regarding the Rosary.



8. The message of the Virgin Mary to the three children at Fathima was that they should recite the Rosary everyday for peace in the world.



9. The impact of the philosophy, thoughts, simple life and practice of devotions was such that the Pope Leo XIII beatified him on the 22 January 1888.



10. The Pope Pius XII canonized him on the 20 th July 1947 and raised him to the level of a Saint.

Intention: We shall, during this decade, pray to God to give us the strength to carry our crosses and follow Jesus.


1.Young Montfort, because of poverty walked 200 kilometers all the way from his house to Paris to study theology.



2. Before crossing the Cesson Bridge, Montfort gave away all he had to the poor and decided to be poor.



3. One of his sayings was, "There is no cross without Jesus and there is no Jesus without the Cross.
We can't think of Christian life without sufferings."




4. As part of his mission he constructed Calvaries in the parishes. This is the Calvary that he built at Pontchateau. St. Montfort had to demolish the Calvary that he constructed because of an order from his Superiors.. He accepted these crosses patiently.




5. St. Montfort had a cross, a Rosary and a Bible in his hands always. He was always in the company of Jesus, Mary and God.



6. He saw a patient covered with wounds and took him to a Religious house. No one opened the door. He shouted saying," Open the door to Jesus" The door was opened and Montfort took the patient in side and took child took children.



7. St. Montfort instituted the congregation of the Brothers of St. Gabriel to educate the poor children. These are the first three pioneers who came to India in 1903.



8. He worked in a hospital at Poitiers as chaplain. He cleaned the wounds of the patients and looked after them. He was sent away but called back at the request of the patients.



9. "Carry your crosses patiently and it will be a light in your darkness."
These are the words of Montfort about sufferings.




10. Montfort further said," If you carry your crosses cheerfully, you will be filled with divine love." Do we carry our crosses cheerfully?

1. This is the statue of St. Montfort in the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome. The Satan is near his feet with the book, "The True Devotion." St. Montfort who wrote it in 1712 himself prophesied that the Satan would prevent its publication.



2. It was discovered in 1842 and brought to the notice of the reigning Pope Gregory XVI who had already declared Montfort ' Venerable' on the 7th Sept 1838. Then it was published. All the Popes began to practice this devotion from then on.



3. His motto was 'God Alone' or "Deus Solus" for which the abbreviations are D+S. The same is the motto of Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel founded by St. Montfort.



4. "Just as Mary brought Jesus to this world the first time. She will bring Jesus the second time too.".



5. "The Son of God became man for our salvation but only in Mary and through Mary.".



6. As at Cana "Mary is the safest, easiest, shortest and most perfect way of approaching Jesus."



7." If we do not risk anything for God, we will never do anything great for Him."



8. "To go to Jesus, we must go to Mary; she is our Mediatrix of intercession."

"Let us walk in the footsteps of Montfort to Jesus through Mary."



9. St. Montfort was a priest. Let us take part in the Eucharist actively and pray for the Montfort Brothers, Fathers, Sisters and members of Associates' Movement and Montfortian Global Associates.



10. "I am between Jesus and Mary. The Satan can't do anything." With these final words of St. Montfort, let us also win the Satan and the world.


